For the six months ended 30 June 2022, the net asset value (NAV) of the Fund rose 2.09% compared with the 1.37% gain in the benchmark FTSE Straits Times Index in Singapore Dollar (SGD) terms.

The Fund's outperformance was largely attributed to positive stock selection in the Industrials and Real **Estate** sectors. This more than offset drags from the **Financials** sector.

Key contributors to performance included Keppel Corporation, CapitaLand Investment Limited and City Developments.

Key detractors included DBS Group Holdings Ltd, iFAST Corporation Ltd and ARA LOGOS Logistics Trust.

As at 30 June 2022, the Fund had the following sector allocation: Financials (43.86%), Industrials (21.64%), Real Estate (19.96%), Communication Services (4.53%), others (6.45%) and 3.56% in cash.

Economic and Market Review

The Asian equity markets kicked off the year on a weak footing and remained in a downtrend for the six-month period under review ended 30 June 2022. Markets were volatile and were dominated by monetary policies of major central banks around the world and a myriad of headwinds. Fears of stagflation, the outburst of Omicron in China and economic risks from a property slowdown in China weighed on investor sentiment.

In February, Asia markets tumbled alongside a global selloff as escalating Russia-Ukraine tensions added to existing concerns over US Fed's rate lift off in March, UST bond vields spiked as investors grappled with the US Fed's hawkish signaling which led to parts of the US yield curve inverting. Despite this, Asia markets outperformed as strength in ASEAN partly offset China's renewed Covid woes.

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A) Fund Performance (continued)

Asia was a relative safe haven amid EU's energy crisis and continued to outperform during the period under review. However, rotation of leaders led to a divergence in performance. In ASEAN, **Indonesia** and **Thailand** led, while **Singapore** was a laggard. **Singapore** initially outperformed in the first quarter of period under review largely driven by the **Financials** sector on back of rising net interest margins, along with an earlier-than-expected economy reopening which supported investor optimism in tourism-related sectors

However, themarket witnessed a reversal as headwinds from rising costs on household spending, easing of pent-up demand and a slowdown in exports weighed on sentiment. As it is, **Singapore**'s preliminary 2Q2022 GDP was unchanged QoQ after recording an upwardly revised 0.9% expansion in first quarter. All three main sectors of manufacturing, services and construction expanded although the pace of increase moderated. On a YoY basis, GDP grew by 4.8% in second quarter.

Amid the higher than expected inflationary pressures, the MAS tightened its monetary policy twice through two off-cycles re-centering of the S\$NEER policy band as it seeks to tamper inflation level. In addition, the government announced a \$1.5 billion fiscal support package on 21st June to alleviate the impact of inflation on the wider population. The support package comprised mostly of utility credits and GST vouchers.

Outlook and Fund Strategy

The outlook for Asia equities market is mixed in the near term amid an uncertain global macro environment. Downward revisions to growth expectations due to supply shocks in food commodities and fossil fuel is playing out. Despite this, corporates' profitability remain susceptible as consumer sentiment turns increasingly fragile against a slowing global growth backdrop even as there are signs of inflation momentum may be slowing ahead.

We expect **Singapore**'s GDP to see a moderation as we head into 2023. The MAS projects GDP growth to come in at the lower half of the 3-5% range forecast for 2022 (vs 2021: 7.6%), and core inflation at 3-4%. **Singapore** is a beneficiary of global re-opening but its exports growth is vulnerable to a global growth slowdown. **Singapore** is highly exposed to EU consumer demand especially in tourism related industries, as well as the US demand mainly through the services sector. This underscores our defensive tilt towards consumer, energy and REITs, as well as a value bias in our positioning.

We have a constructive view on reopening plays as we expect the return of tourists and global travel to pick up. This should provide a boost to retail spending and hospitality/tourism-related industry in general. Hospitality and Retail REITs notably in prime Orchard areas are beneficiaries.

In addition, we have preference for potential inflation hedges amid an elevated inflation environment. Selective property, industrial and consumer durables are likely to fare better due to a more limited impact on demand. In particular, **Consumer Staples** with strong pricing power and value food services would be more resilient. We have also positioned favorably in the **Energy** sector for its earnings resilience on back of its inelastic demand amid rising power costs.

Key risks to our defensive positioning include a drastic global growth slowdown, elevated and/or longer than expected inflationary pressures and a faster taper by central banks.
